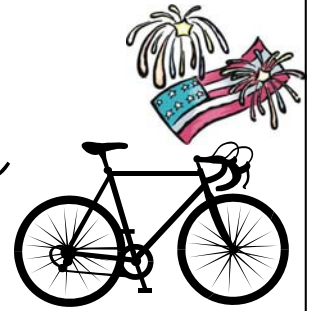

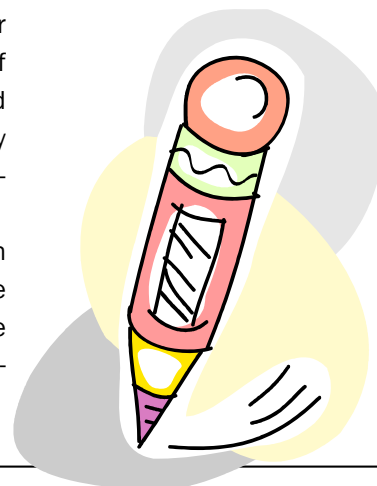
CARLISLE FOURTH-GRADERS

HAVE COUNTY'S HIGHEST READING PROFICIENCY AT 91%

Students improved or maintained reading and math proficiency scores for fourth and eighth grade in Carlisle. Fourth-graders achieved a proficiency of 89 percent in math and 91 percent in reading. Eighth-graders improved scores to 82 percent proficiency in math and 79 percent in reading.

"I think what's helping the scores is that we are as a district, drilling down and able to diagnose the student's struggles a lot more specifically and tailor instruction to support those kids." Mebus said. "Our professional development has gotten more targeted as well."

The scores were an increase from both last year's classes and these students' third and seventh grade scores, said Robin Mebus, Carlisle curriculum coordinator.

PARTNERSHIP ADVOCATES FOR PRO-GROWTH STATE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

The Greater Des Moines Partnership advocates for state policies that help drive regional economic growth.

During the 2009 legislative session, the Partnership advocated for multiple pro-growth initiatives that were signed into law. In summary, the Legislature and Governor raised the annual cap on Historic Property Rehabilitation Tax Credits from \$20 million to \$50 million, enacted new tax incentives for data center projects, and provided \$12 million in continued funding for the Community Attraction and Tourism program, \$3 million in funding for passenger rail, and continued funding for regional business accelerators. In many ways, the success of this legislative session also is measured by the legislation that did NOT pass. Proposals to significantly reduce and restrict the research activities

credit, restrictions on Tax Increment Financing, "Fair Share" legislation that would have compromised Iowa's Right to Work status, the establishment of a prevailing wage rate for public construction projects, the modification of the workers compensation system to allow for doctor shopping, and open scope bargaining for public employees were all defeated.

The Partnership supported many other pro-economic growth priorities that were enacted and opposed other anti-business proposals that were successfully defeated. 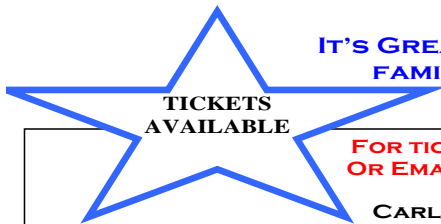

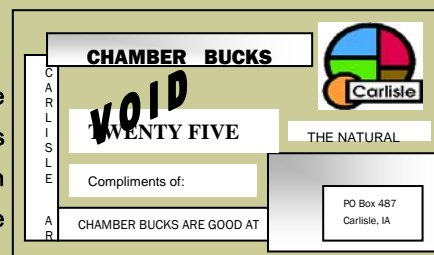

METRO WASTE AUTHORITY GRANT USE



A grant from Metro Waste Authority has again been received to use towards the Beautification Projects in Carlisle. This is very much appreciated by the entire community. Without these funds, it would not be possible to have these lovely planters for everyone to enjoy. Three new planters have been placed by the Hunt's Standard Service Station on School Street.

In addition to the planters, this year a Rain Garden has also been constructed at the Summerset Bike Trailhead.



What is a Rain Garden? A rain garden is an attractive native plant garden with a special purpose, to reduce and filter the storm water entering our local waters. It is constructed as a place to direct storm water from roofs, driveways and parking lots, allowing water to be held in the plants, mulch and soil. Rain gardens are created in low-lying areas with specific

layers of soil, sand, and organic mulch. These layers naturally filter the rain as it runs into the rain garden and into our rivers.
