August – December 1990 Events

- The <u>Plainfield Tornado</u> (F5 on the <u>Fujita</u> scale) strikes the towns of <u>Plainfield</u>, <u>Crest Hill</u>, and <u>Joliet</u>, <u>Illinois</u>, killing 29 people (the strongest tornado to date to strike the <u>Chicago metropolitan area</u>).
- The earliest known portable <u>digital</u>
 <u>camera</u> sold in the United States ships.

Professional Development to Make More Sales

Jim Rohn, a top motivational speaker, advised to work hard on yourself than you do on your business. So, what can you do to work harder on yourself to develop your ability to make more sales? Here are two ideas.

- Learn to ask open ended questions that help you gather information and start a solid relationship. You will also find out if your product or service will be of value to this prospect. The key: Listen.
- Get good at storytelling. Include testimonials. Talk about the value your clients receive. Find the best way to tell the story of your product or company, and that always starts with the value you bring your customer.

Workforce Development Issue: Finding Qualified Employees

- With lowa's unemployment rate holding at 4%, the lack of qualitied employees is a reality for our local businesses. Those applying may not have the skills needed to do the job, may lack required people and communication skills or may fail background or drug tests.
- 50% of jobs require more than a high school diploma or associates degree, and applicants are not prepared.
- Skilled Iowa Initiatives is a program working to identify and increase the skill levels so allow workers great jobs and employers better employees.


