



EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM (EAS)

The Governor recently received notification from the FCC of a nationwide EAS test that will take place on Nov. 9 and asked that we share this information with all of you.

On November 9, 2011 at 2 PM Eastern Standard Time, FEMA and the FCC will conduct the first ever, top-to-bottom nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS). The EAS is a media communications-based alerting system that is designed to transmit emergency alerts and warnings to the public at the National, state and local levels. EAS participants broadcast alerts and warnings regarding weather alerts, child abductions and other types of emergencies. EAS alerts are transmitted over radio and television broadcast stations, cable television and other media services. The purpose of the November 9th test is to asses the reliability and effectiveness of the system as a way to alert the public during nationwide emergencies.

FEMA and the FCC are taking a number of steps to prepare for this historic test. Both agencies are conducting meetings, webinars and other activities to educate government agencies about the test. In addition, the FCC has established a website dedicated to the November 9th test which can be found on PSHSB's website at www.fcc.gov/pshs.
