



Ready, Set, Go! Here Comes 2014!

Whether your business is thriving or surviving, January is a good time to take a look at where you are compared to where you want to be. Consider what you are spending the most time on and whether it is worth the time. Review what is working and what's not, and be open to making some changes. Network or read to find new ideas that work. And think about what you need to do to gear up and recharge for the new year – and when you are going to make the time to do it. Both Mayor Ruth Randleman and Paul Nolte, President, Carlisle Area Chamber of Commerce, thanked the people who had worked hard to bring this project to Carlisle and also expressed appreciation that Danamere Village Townhomes will provide young teachers and professionals with an affordable option for living in Carlisle.

Wearing hardhats and ceremonially turning the dirt at the groundbreaking in the media center at the Carlisle Middle School were HRC Senior Vice President, Steve Niebuhr, and HRC Development Vice President Kris Saddoris, Mayor Ruth Randleman and Chamber President Paul Nolte from Carlisle, and Bankers Trust Assistant Vice President Commercial Real Estate, Becky Fluegge,.

The rental townhome community located at 840 Bellflower Drive is to be completed by the fall of 2014. The projected \$5.8 million development will be comprised of 44 townhomes within 22 duplexes. All townhomes are two-story, three-bedroom, and two-and—a-half-bath homes with one-car garages. The townhomes feature contemporary interiors, open living areas, large master suites with private bathrooms and walk-in closets, and in-home washers and dryers.
