Let's Celebrate the Carlisle Chamber 1990 - 2015

Enterprising entrepreneurs have been doing business in Carlisle since the winter of 1846-47. On January 8, 1850, Jeremiah Church established the Post Office and was also the first merchant in Dudley (after the floods of 1851, the town was moved to present day Carlisle), along with early shopkeepers, Abraham and Jack Shoemaker. Dr. W.H. Ward was the first Doctor. It is likely these early business men networked and worked together to grow their community.

The Businessmen's Monthly Lunch was going strong for decades with tasty meals like chicken and noodles or roast beef, and pie, always pie, being served by the ladies at the American Legion.

By 1990 the group began operating more like a "chamber" and organized to become chartered as a chamber.

Marketing Your Business

Scott Flood in *The Single Most Powerful Word in Marketing (It is not FREE)* reminds us, "When someone uses "you" in conversation, a person subconsciously perks up such as when they hear their name.

Using the word "you" tells our brains someone is sending a message intended specifically for us, so our subconscious prods us to pay closer attention to the rest of the message.

"You" is even more effective because so many companies and organizations use it sparingly, it at all. Many Websites and marketing materials frequently use "we" and "us" and "our".

Professionals and executives have a similar tendency to overuse "I," "me," and "my."

SO ... get the prospects attention by speaking to them (You) and make it clear how they will benefit when they are doing business with you.

Professional Development Tips for Success and Less Stress

- Spend the minutes of your day wisely
 - Plan tomorrow before tomorrow arrives.
 - Block sections in your calendar with specific times in the week for family time, appointments, meetings, prospecting, customer service, responding to emails and phone calls and emergencies, lunch, exercise, and free time. Get up an walk around for a few minutes every hour ... it refreshed the brain.

Professional Development Tips for Success and Less Stress

- Have a to do list and work through it.
 - Stop multi-tasking. Do and complete one things at a time
 - Do the most important thing on your to-do list first every day.
 - Check email and social media accounts at the time blocked for them on your calendar ... not every time you hear the "ding".
- Be clear and concise in communication
 - Block time to communicate. Pick up the phone and call. It builds relationship and takes less time to get an answer.
 - Send shorter, to the point emails or texts.

Surprising Forecast for Employees in the Central Iowa Area

- The Workforce and Education pillar of the Greater Des Moines Partnership is concerned that, in 2017, the Central Iowa Area will not have the employees available to fulfill the demand from business.
- To help increase the number of people available in the workforce, GDMP actively encourages those who have left lowa to return.
- EDGE (Education Drives a Greater Economy) is a program that has the Partnership working with schools to prepare students for jobs that will be waiting for them.

- The Partnership worked with Capital Crossroads, Character Counts, and the Institute for Excellence and Ethics to produce the online survey.


