CARLISLE FOODS WILL BE MISSED

The doors to Carlisle Foods opened for the last time on Saturday, June 1st after 33 years of business here in Carlisle.

History of the Carlisle Foods Store as written by Kay Scholl:

It all began 54 years ago for Bill, who at that time, went to work for his stepfather in a small grocery store in Rockford, Iowa. He continued to work there through his teen years and from there went to work for Blue Ribbon Packing Plant. That job was abruptly interrupted by Uncle Sam as he was called to the Army and soon found himself fighting the war in Vietnam.

It was after his return to the States that he met Kay. They eventually married and settled in Cresco, Iowa. Kay owned and operated her beauty salon and Bill took a position as Meat Dept. Manager for a Nash Finch store. It was there that he met Scott Havens who was the Grocery Dept Manager at the same store. Approximately 12 years later, the two decided to form a partnership and purchase the AGI store from Harry and Marie Lewis. In October of 1980 we settled in as owners and operators of Carlisle Foods. In 1986, the community of Norwalk asked us to look at them for expansion, so in 1987 Plaza Foods was built. It created a hassle traveling back and forth trying to manage both, so in 1990 we decided to split the partnership. There have been many roller coaster rides the last 33 years, some good and some not so good.

We raised our two sons, Matt and Chad while living here. Both boys worked at the store as soon as they were old enough, with Chad becoming a master at making broasted chicken! Matt was also a dedicated volunteer Firefighter and EMT for the City, but was called home by the Lord several years ago. We received guardianship of Matt's son, so we are currently raising a teenager once again. Chad now works for the Safran Companies as a computer IT. He is married and has two daughters and a year and a half old son. We feel enormously blessed to have these grandchildren and now have more time to spend with them!

The decision to close the store is somewhat a bittersweet. The small 'ma & pa' stores are slowly going by the wayside as the larger chains take over. But, with progress comes changes in many phases and we are anxious to start a new phase in our lives.

We had been mulling this decision around for some time but really started think on definite terms last fall when we lost yet another sister (you have the time to do some serious thinking when you're doing your sisters' hair for the very last time)! Then, when we started losing friends younger than ourselves, we decided we should stop working 7 days a week and start spending more time with family & friends. The fact that we too have some health issues also had an impact on the decision.

We will definitely miss our loyal customers who became more than just customers to us. Many friendships were formed through the years. About mid March I'm sure I will miss someone asking me how soon my plants will arrive. As for our employee, they were more like family than employees and most of us will likely stay in touch. We will also miss the vendors we became close with, which was pretty much all of them after that many years!



As for the future, who knows, maybe something part-time, maybe a small business that's not quite so demanding or maybe just sitting on the front porch like we did back when times were less hectic. But for now
