Todd & Peggy have their studio at 4590 E Payton Ave, (in Old Avon), Carlisle.

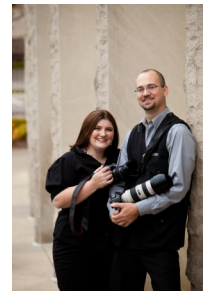
They purchased this home and have been busy turning a room and the garage out back into their studio. They also have some outdoor settings they use mainly for graduation pictures.

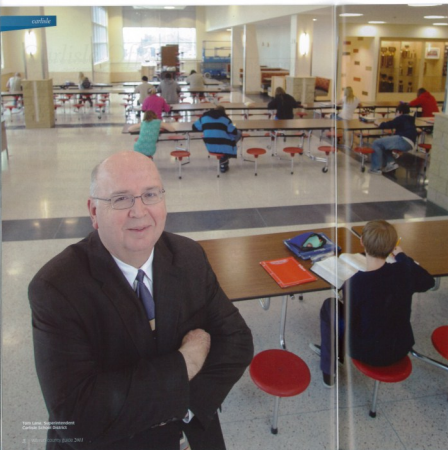

"This is a great place to live and educate kids," said Tom Lane, superintendent of the Carlisle Community School District. "We still have a small-town feel, the community is safe and families are very

Students benefit from small class sizes (19 to 22 students per classroom at the elementary level) and the opportunity to participate in many extracurricular activities, said Lane, who noted that Carlisle has become a magnet school. In fact, one out of every three students in the district comes from the Eastern Lake area of Des Moines. This is reflected in the district's enrollment numbers, which have jumped from 1,275 students in 2000 to 1,970 students in 2011. To meet the needs of this growing student body, the district has

"When the U.S. Highway 65/Iowa Highway 51 bypass was completed, that changed everything for Carlisle," Lane said. "It offers a convenient connection to the area and continues to help us grow."

The Carlisle school district also focuses on classes that help students expand their knowledge while developing lifelong skills. High school juniors and seniors, for example, can participate in multi-occupations cooperative (MOC) education, a work-study program that relies on the support of area business such as School Street Scholars Daycare in Carlisle.

"Cardinal maintains the feel of a traditional main town while embracing modern amenities," says Rudy, city administrator, who noted that Cardillo's 2010 population of 3,728 represents a 15 percent jump over its 2000 population.

Nestled off the Highway 5 bypass, Cardillo is located just minutes from Interstate 26/90, as well as downtown Des Moines. "This high-traffic location makes it easy for us to get to the highway," says Rudy. "Highway 5 bypass is a huge benefit." said Steve Curran, who manages the General Mills food processing plant, which has been operating there since 1984.

The plant, which employs nearly 100 people, makes Betty Crocker punch mixes for cakes, brownies, muffins and cereals. "We're one of the largest producers of cereal in the world," says Curran. "A grain of sugar is shipped in by train, Cardillo's location on the main line of the Union Pacific Railroad is another plus." Curran said. Cardillo also has a large number of other businesses that locate here because of the General Mills plant, which prompted a major expansion in 2001. "The labor force here is composed of some of the best workers working for others," Curran said.

To help support new businesses that increase financing projects are available, said Rudy, who noted that Cardillo has a small business center and offers incentives to attract Cardillo for a variety of reasons.

"People have faith in the future of our business district," added Rudy, who noted that a new private studio called "The Studio," and Dorian's

Professional recently constructed a new building in town.

Business owners and their employees who live in Carleise appreciate the community's top-rated schools and safe, family-friendly neighborhoods, including Deermead Farms.
